Importance of Sharing the Gospel

Sharing the Gospel is essential. Our Thursday night studies aim to equip us as Gospelers. Many individuals struggle with sharing due to feelings of unpreparedness, but remember, you are enough through God. Simply tell your story and express who you are in Christ. You are enough!

The Significance of Being Born Again

The most vital birth is being born again, as emphasized in John 3:3, where Jesus states, "Unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." This highlights the necessity of spiritual transformation to experience God's kingdom. Last week, we discussed how Jesus used scripture to resist temptation, demonstrating that God's word is our shield.

Genealogy of Jesus

This week, we discussed the importance of Jesus' genealogy. It is found in both Matthew and Luke, these genealogies trace Jesus' lineage back to significant figures such as Abraham and David. Acts 13:22–23 emphasizes that God promised a Savior from David's lineage, fulfilling Old Testament prophecies. Genealogies were an important part of Jewish culture, determining land inheritance and community belonging. They show Jesus as a descendant of Abraham, whose lineage promised blessings for all nations (Galatians 3:7–9, 16). Furthermore, Jesus' descent from David fulfills prophecies about the Messiah coming from his line (2 Samuel 7:12–14).

Redemptive Role of Jesus

The genealogies illustrate the significance of Jesus' birth is not just in His earthly lineage but in His role as the promised Savior who redeems humanity from sin.

Jesus' Call to Discipleship (Fishers of Men!)

Jesus' call to His disciples marks the beginning of His public ministry. In Matthew 4:17, He proclaims, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." Repentance signifies turning away from sin and seeking forgiveness. Jesus invites us to a new life, emphasizing the importance of spreading the Gospel.

In Matthew 4:19, He calls Simon Peter and Andrew to be "<u>fishers of men,</u>" symbolizing our mission to bring others to faith. **Meaning of "Fishers of Men":** This represents the act of actively seeking and bringing people to the Christian faith. This is a pivotal moment in the calling of Jesus' disciples, signifying their mission to spread the Gospel.

Recap:

- Jesus used scripture, and we should too.
- Jesus' genealogy is important as it fulfilled the prophecies in the Old Testament.
- · Jesus is calling us to be fishers of men!

Let's embrace our calling and grow together in faith!



Weekly Update for our Bible/Book Study!


Here are some **key takeaways** to consider while reading **Chapter 2**:
